- 3) The campaign finance disclosure requirements contained in chapter 130, RSMo;
- 4) Any code of conduct promulgated by any department, division or agency of state government, or by state institutions of higher education, or by executive order;
- 5) The conflict of interest laws contained in sections 105.450 to 105.467 and section 171.181, RSMo; and
- 6) The provisions of the constitution or state statute or order, ordinance or resolution of any political subdivision relating to the official conduct of officials or employees of the state and political subdivisions.

This complaint shall contain all the facts known to the person bringing the complaint that give rise to the complaint.

This complaint shall be sworn to under penalty of the crime of perjury.

Within 5 days of receipt of this complaint, the Commission will send a copy of this complaint, including the name of the person bringing this complaint, to the person, organization or campaign committee against whom the complaint is brought.

Note: According to Missouri State Law, the Commission shall dismiss any complaint which is frivolous in nature, as lacking any basis in fact or law. Any person who submits a frivolous complaint shall be liable for actual and compensatory damages to the alleged violator for holding the alleged violator before the public in a false light. A finding by the Commission that a complaint is frivolous or without probable cause shall be a public record.

On Feb	oruary 2, 2016, he testified in opposition to HB 1823 before the House Agriculture Policy Committee, of which I am the
Chairr	man. In 2017, he testified at least three times in opposition to various pieces of legislation, including:
1. On	January 18, 2017, he testified in opposition to HB 71 before the House Small Business Committee.
2. On F	ebruary 21, 2017, he testified in opposition to SB 76 before the Senate Local Government and Elections Committee.
3. On <i>i</i>	April 12, 2017, Mr. Smith testified in opposition to HB 113 before the House Local Government Committee.
Mr. Smi	th has also participated in and led the Lobby Day activities for the Missouri Rural Crisis Center in the Missouri State Capitol.
During	said events, he spoke to legislators and attempted to influence policy. He also distributed handouts, which are
include	ed in the attachments. According to RSMo 105.470, a lobbyist is an individual who attempts to influence state
execut	ive, state legislative, or state judicial actions; and meets one or more of the following: a) acting in the ordinary
course	of business b) engaged in pay as a lobbyist; c) designated to act as a lobbyist by a person, business entity,
governi	mental entity, religious organization, nonprofit corporation, association or other entity; and d) spend \$50 or more on
behalf	of public officials, annually, from January 1 through December 31. It is my belief that Mr. Smith has
met o	ne or more of the aforementioned criteria and that he is lobbying in direct violation of RSMo
105.47	70, since he is not a registered lobbyist in the state of Missouri. For all of the reasons listed above,
	ectfully request that you open an investigation of Brian Smith of Missouri Rural Crisis Center.

Dear Director Klahr-

Over the last several years, a Missouri resident named Brian Smith has repeatedly testified on various pieces of legislation at the Missouri State Capitol, before numerous committees in both the House and Senate. Mr. Smith does not testify on behalf of himself as an individual, rather, he continually speaks on behalf of Missouri Rural Crisis Center, a statewide organization based in Columbia.

As you are aware, the Missouri Ethics Commission website plainly states that "a lobbyist is an individual who attempts to influence state executive, state legislative, or state judicial actions; and meets one or more of the following: a) acting in the ordinary course of business; b) engaged in pay as a lobbyist; c) designated to act as a lobbyist by a person, business entity, governmental entity, religious organization, nonprofit corporation, association or other entity; and d) spends \$50 or more on behalf of public officials, annually, from January 1 through December 31."

After a relatively quick search, I was able to identify four instances where Mr. Smith testified on legislation on behalf of Missouri Rural Crisis Center. In 2016, Mr. Smith testified in opposition to HB 1823 in the House Ag Policy Committee on February 2nd. In 2017, Mr. Smith testified in opposition to the following bills: HB 71 on January 18th in the Small Business Committee, HB 113 on April 12th in the House Local Government Committee and SB 76 in the Senate Local Government & Elections Committee. Witness forms and committee notes are attached.

According to Sections 105.470 RSMo, Mr. Smith is not operating in accordance with Missouri law and I request that the Missouri Ethics Commission examine this issue.

As a state representative and Chairman of the House Agriculture Policy Committee, this is a flagrant disregard of the integrity of our statehouse. Mr. Smith attends many committee hearings relating to agriculture and he leads 'lobby days' at the State Capitol for members of Missouri Rural Crisis Center, handing out materials, as provided in the enclosures.

Our laws are established to protect transparency, however, it appears Mr. Smith's lobbying activities are in violation of the law relating to 501c3 non-profit corporations and tax-deductible donations, which the Missouri Rural Crisis Center accepts.

The people of Missouri deserve transparency. While citizens have the right to lobby their representatives, they must do so in accordance with state statute. I believe Mr. Smith should register as a lobbyist since he is actively working to influence legislation, at both the county and state level.

SB 627, SB 1018, HB 1614 would take away the ability of county commissions and local elected representatives to protect Missouri's water, local farmers and rural citizens from corporate out-of-state and foreign CAFO waste. 19 rural Missouri counties have taken measures to protect their communities from the negative impacts of CAFO waste.

Many new CAFOs are targeting Missouri and are calling themselves "export only" operations, which means the millions of gallons of industrial livestock waste that is being applied to land is going essentially unregulated by our Department of Natural Resources.

And, now these bills could take away the rights of all local communities to put in place adequate safeguards to protect the water and health from the negative impacts of literally millions of gallons of untreated CAFO waste.

That's why Local Control is so important. Local Control is the right of local elected representatives to protect their constituents, their health and property rights from the negative impacts of out-of-state and foreign CAFO corporations.

House Bills 2206 & 2161 would prohibit the future purchase of Missouri farmland by foreign interests.

In the 2013 legislative session a bill passed that opened up 289,000 acres of Missouri farmland that can be owned by foreign corporations. Right now foreign interests own 94,418 acres of Missouri farmland. And over 40,000 acres are controlled by the Shuanghui Group, a Chinese meatpacker that has intimate ties to the Chinese government.
