I am writing to you today on behalf of Mr. Kevin Strickland Date of Birth 06/07/1959 DOC# 36922. Mr. Strickland is currently incarcerated at the Western Missouri Correctional Center in Cameron, Missouri. He was convicted on the charges of Capital Murder in a triple homicide case in 1978 and sentenced to life without the possibility of parole. Recent evidence has shown that Mr. Strickland was falsely accused for crimes he did not commit. The witness Cynthia Douglas was a young woman in 1978 who was traumatized during the triple murder. She witnessed the murders of her three friends and was shot herself on the day the crime took place. Later on she officially stated that she did not name Mr. Strickland until the following day and only after her sister's boyfriend suggested Strickland might be involved in the shooting. She has made it known that she was wrong in naming Mr. Strickland as a suspect after Strickland's trial.
